After Mass, everyone will proceed by foot or carpool to the state capitol for the **30th Annual March for Life** (limited transportation will be provided to and from the Capitol). All are welcome to return to St. Michael's after the March for a **complimentary lunch**, which will be served by the Knights of Columbus. Please invite family and friends to join you in letting our state representatives know that all life is sacred.

In all the dioceses of the United States, January 22 shall be observed as a particular day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, and of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life.

10:00 a.m. Mass will be celebrated with violet vestments as an appropriate liturgical observance for this day. All Priests from our [Diocese](#) are invited to concelebrate this Mass with Auxiliary Bishop Eusebio Elizondo at Saint Michael Church in Olympia at 10 a.m.
